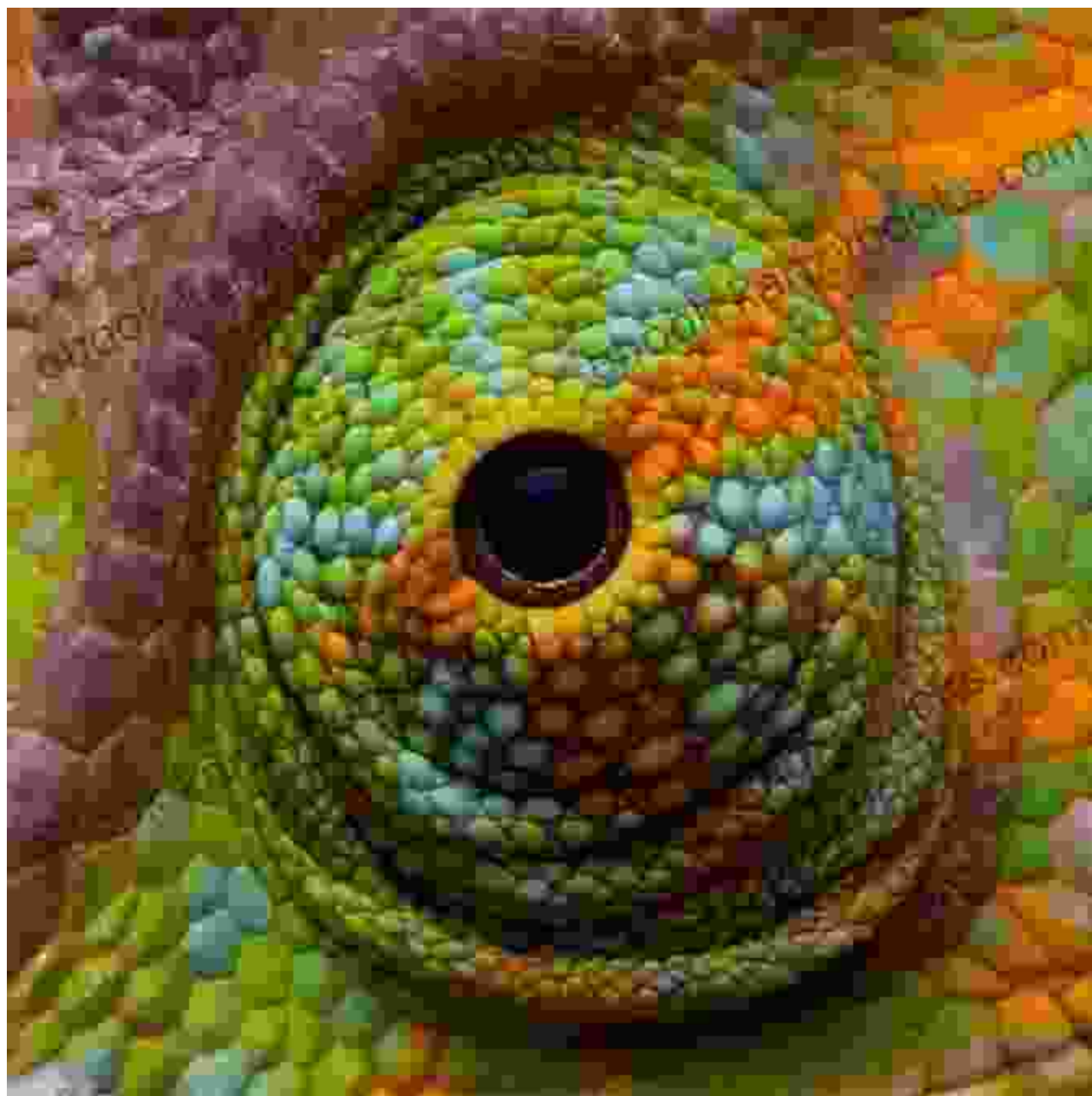
The Telephoto Eyes of Deep-Sea Fish
