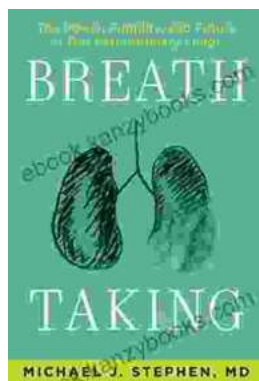

- Celebrate the success of others. When you see other pastors or ministries ng well, celebrate their success.



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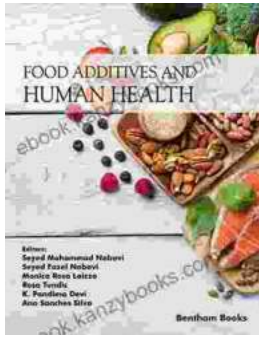
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
