



Therefore, Muslims on the obligation of zakat will focus on the classical scholar's views over relevant tradition of zakat in the Quran and Sunnah.

The obligation of zakat is affirmed by the Quran where Allah commands the prophet to collect zakat from the rich people who possess and distribute it to the poor. Allah says:

Of their worldly treasures, that is those which it justly and legally belongs and goes on their behalf. Then let the poor are a burden of poverty for them. And Allah is One Who is free from all defect. (Quran 9:60)

Following this revelation, the Prophet practically sent Mu'awiyah to Yemen as a governor and instructed him saying:
